

Jury Comments: highly functional utilitarian design, yet graceful, elegant. Small accessory building appropriate to wooded double setting serves purpose as guest quarters, and could easily be converted to residential use. Interior monitor provides good daylighting, soft finishes and contrast of materials, light touch of color delight

the eye. Jury also liked use of sliding panels to separate back rooms and storage closets, panels also serve as display walls for weaving projects. It is exceptional for what is accomplished with a small space; it suggests possibilities for single residence design. It is situated in the landscape so as to harmonize with its surroundings, using a contemporary design that expands the "northwest aesthetic." The proportions and use of color enlivens the simplicity of the interior design and organization. Placement of skylights adds to dimensionality of the interior space.

Jury comments: Admirable community process helped inform master plan. Jury was impressed with framework principles to 1) improve marine habitat/ecological heath; 2) public access to shoreline; 3) increased public open space and parks; 4) re-knitting of urban streets grid and connectivity to downtown;

and 5) increase housing densities and economic development opportunities. The jury felt some of the early plan goals were diminished in the final master plan and general development plan. We were especially impressed with the earlier versions of the plan because of the green space for public use, the street and walkway plan's attention to the grid of Bellingham's city center, and to the orientation of business/residential structures to be built along Whatcom Creek. The grid plan of the waterfront development sustained an authenticity of place by its close relation to the orientation of the downtown streets. This is enhanced by the orientation of buildings across Whatcom Creek to working aspects of the waterfront. Situated adjacent to the planned public greenspace, the orientation provides a fluid movement into the city and its greenways. These advantages were lost by the final iteration.

Jury comments: Communicates through excellent set of well illustrated examples and pattern language the set of buildings and architectural features that provide authenticity and sense of place to the town center. The approach to recommendations is flexible rather than prescriptive, and respects passage of time, varying historic periods reflected in the architecture. The jury suggests the architectural recommendations could be augmented with a set of streetscape guidelines/ recommendations to enhance the pedestrian experience through pedestrian amentias such as way finding, lighting, sidewalks, and landscaping, etc.
